Greater Depth Explain whether multiple expanded noun phrases have been correctly identified within a sentence. Expanded noun phrases include an adverb, an adjective and a preposition.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Application)

Developing Write a sentence using an expanded noun phrase to describe an alien. Expanded noun phrase to include an adjective and a preposition.

Expected Write two sentences using expanded noun phrases to describe two aliens. Expanded noun phrases to include two adjectives and a preposition.

Greater Depth Write three sentences using expanded noun phrases to describe three aliens. Expanded noun phrases to include an adjective and a preposition. Sentences to include an adverb.




