


Art Task Week 2 - 30.03.2020

Read the following information and look at the examples of his work. Then choose a challenge to complete – It is up to you which (or how many) challenges you do.


In addition to the challenge sheets, there are some recommended links for more information on M.C Escher if you wish to find out more about the artist.

Tessellation

Tessellations are created when shapes are repeated again and again with no gaps or overlapping.



M.C.Escher

M.C.Esher or Maurits Cornelis Escher was born in 1898 and died in 1972. He was from the Netherlands.

Escher didn't do very well at school but he was a very talented artist.



M.C.Escher

Whilst visiting the Alhambra in Spain, he became fascinated by the mathematical designs and patterns that he saw there. He was inspired to produce his own tessellations.









Did you know?


Tessellation Task
